APR 10th 1-3pm Spring Wildflowers: More Than Just a Pretty Face ------outdoor pgm—TIPP AMPH Enjoy a woodland spring hike with Mary Cutler (Naturalist, Tippecanoe Co. Park & Rec. Dept.) as she shares fascinating floral facts and folklore associated with the diverse wildflowers that can be seen along the Tippecanoe Co. Amphitheater trails. Bob Easter (Director of Stewardship, NICHES Land Trust) leads this hike on new trails at Fall Creek Gorge Nature Preserve in Warren Co.; this property is re-opening to the public after being closed since 2021 due to overuse. Extensive stewardship is underway at the preserve along with vegetative monitoring which will guide future management. A special treat: we'll be joined by renowned watercolorist Rena Brouwer and others, who will be creating artistic responses to the beauty of the property along the trail. Experience the iconic landscapes of the Big Pine Valley on this moderate hike. APR 24th 1-3pm Mover-Gould Mosey -------Outdoor pgm—NICHES/MGW Dan Childs (wildflower enthusiast and author) leads a leisurely stroll along the 1-mile trail at this NICHES Carroll Co. nature preserve, where a wide variety of spring wildflowers abound! Dan's wildflower books will be available for purchase (check or Venmo). "Carex" is a genus of sedges often overlooked or misidentified despite being one of the most diverse plant genera in North America. IU researcher Rich Hull discusses his work at the park on a hike showcasing the identifying features of a variety of sedges and where you can normally find them. MAY 8th 9-11am Spring on the Wing at Celery Bog -----NOTE: morning program------Bring binoculars --- outdoor pgm—CBNA/LNC Join Kyle Gebhart (West Lafayette Parks Naturalist) and members of the Sycamore Audubon Society for a hike on the Celery Bog trails to see both returning migrants and resident birds. **NOTE**: IF RAINING, program will move indoors to Lilly Nature Center. Tom Swinford (Director of Stewardship, The Nature Conservancy) will share the unique ecology of this Putnam Co. nature preserve, consisting of rich oak woodlands & high-quality floodplains along Big Walnut Creek. Being part of the 3,500 acre Big Walnut Conservation Area makes site a magnet for migratory birds in the spring. MAY 22nd 2:30-4:30pm Fire and Ice at Indiana Dunes National Park: A Hike through Miller Woods --Bring binoculars-- outdoor pgm—IN-DUNES Journey through a globally rare black oak savanna, around towering sand dunes, past interdunal wetlands, and along the shores of Lake Michigan on this hike through Miller Woods. Park Ranger Kip Walton (Outreach Coordinator, Indiana Dunes National Park) will share the story of a landscape shaped by the forces of nature. Entrance FEE \$25/car OR free entry with National Park Pass. NOTE: 2:30-4:30pm EDT (1:30-3:30pm CDT in Gary) MAY 29th 1-3pm Legislation & Stewardship: A Guided Hike at Laura Hare Bend of the Wabash East------- outdoor pgm—NICHES/GSB NICHES Land Trust staff and State Senator Spencer Derry lead a hike through the Laura Hare Bend of the Wabash East property, weaving the interconnectedness of legislative and environmental preservation. NICHES staff will highlight the ongoing restoration of this site and Senator Derry will discuss legislation aimed at large water withdrawals proposed in the region. JUN 5th 1-3pm A Bird in the Hand: Using Mist Nets to Capture Birds ------Join Dr. Mickey & Sally Weeks (Purdue University, Retired) as they share the scientific practice of mist-netting: capturing and banding birds to study. JUN 12th 10am-12:30pm Unique Fen & Marsh Wetland Plants at Pisgah Marsh Nature Preserve --NOTE: morning program - outdoor pgm—PMNP View a host of unusual and uncommon wetland plants at this off-trail hike in Kosciusko Co. through fen and marsh wetlands with Scott Namestnik (Botanist, IDNR Div. of Nature Preserves). Expect muddy, mucky conditions and shallow water; rubber boots and long-sleeved shirts are recommended. Limited to 15 participants. JUN 19th 1-3pm Community Foresight & Protection: A Hike through Attica's Arms Woods ------ outdoor pgm-RP-AW Justin Harmeson (NICHES Stewardship Mgr & Attica Park Board President) leads a hike through Arms Woods in Attica, a high-quality oak woodland nestled into the city. This hike highlights how ongoing management, long-standing protection, and current public use all mesh to create a healthy ecological system. Learn about native plants, water resources, and how we can mimic natural processes to create sustainable solutions to environmental challenges in modern landscapes on this stroll through Durkees Run Stormwater Park with Jake Talley (Green Infrastructure Manager, Lafayette Renew).
