## Saturday, September 3rd

10am-1pm Pedal Prophetstown State Park

#### Noon-2pm Living History on The Farm: The Gibson Kitchen

# Friday, September 9th

7:30pm-9pm Night Sky Wellness Walk

Join a naturalist for a guided night sky walk! During this leisurely stroll, we'll take time to appreciate the sights and sounds of Prophetstown State Park after dark. Bring a blanket for the chance to stargaze! This walk is about 0.5 miles in length and takes place on flat, level ground. Meet at the Meadow View Picnic Area. #### Sunday, September 11th

#### 1:30pm-3pm Walking Stick Workshop
