Join us as a sponsor or exhibitor at the Indiana Native Plant Society's 31st annual conference as we explore and define our roles in Nourishing the Web of Life. Sponsor and exhibitor details follow, but first here's a look at our line-up of distinguished presenters.

- **Dr. Desiree Narango: Landscaping for Pollinators and Birds at Home.** Critical to this topic is her research with Dr. Doug Tallamy on how residential landscapes and gardening practices influence wildlife habitats.
- **Myrene Brown: Spring Ephemerals / No Forest Needed.** In her sunny Zionsville garden, Myrene grows spring ephemerals, their own ambassadors of beauty and interesting connections to insects, joined later by other native plants.
- **Roger Hedge: An Armchair Tour of Indiana's Ferns.** Hedge shares his fascination with Indiana's approximately 80 species of ferns. Varied leaf shapes and patterns make up for a lack of colorful, showy flowers.
- **Dr. Justin Maxwell: What Trees Tell Us About Indiana's Past Climate.** Maxwell, climate scientist and forest ecologist, helps us understand how climate and soil moisture has varied and how this informs us about water management plans.
- **Scott Namestnik: Indiana's Endangered and Threatened Species; What Makes Our Rare Plants Rare.** Namestnik spotlights vascular plant species listed as endangered or threatened in Indiana. Through his eyes we consider factors leading to inclusion of plants on our endangered and threatened species list.
- **Dr. Christian Krupke: Pollinators, Plants and Ponds—exploring the unintended consequences of modern corn and soybean insect pest management.** Krupke summarizes research findings from Purdue and elsewhere about the non-target impact of our most commonly used pesticides. His research elucidates strengths and weaknesses of the primary pest

management approaches used in corn and soybeans and emphasizes the impact on non-target life of neonicotinoid seed treatments.
